

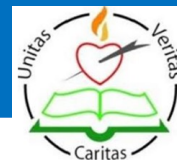

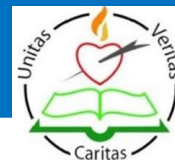

15. Brendan Lyng – Lecturer Computing and Maths - WIT

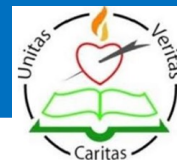

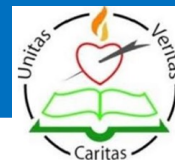

32. Mark Codd – Psychiatric Nurse

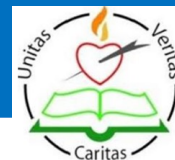

43. Noel Purcell – Welder/Fitter

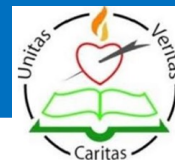

59. Eileen O' Rourke – Chief Executive Officer, Carlow Tourism

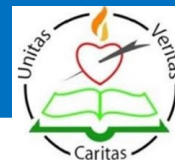

60. Tina Walsh – Lecturer on Culinary Arts & Hospitality Management Programmes, WIT

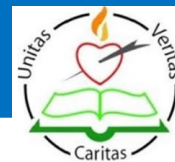
